Requirements for abstracts:

General size - 2-3 pages; A-4 (a file with the extension * .doc and NOT docx); font - Times New Roman, 14 pt .; spacing - 1,5; indention - 1.25 cm; all margins - 2 cm. The text shall be presented as follows: Title of the paper (font – bold, centered); surname and first name of the author(s) (font - bold, italic); his/her post, university, city, country, e-mail) – font - italics, single spacing; one line pass; the main body.

List of sources used for writing abstracts shall be located at the end of the text in alphabetical order, without indentation, single spaced, font 12 pt. under the heading References. References in the text of the article should be submitted only in square brackets, for example [1], [1; 6], where numbers 1 and 6 correspond to the serial number of the work or source in the List of used sources. If references to sources are consecutive from 1 to 6, then [1-4]. References to specific pages should be given after the source number with a comma followed by the lowercase letter “c.”), for example: [1, p. 5]. If there are references to several works, they are separated by semicolons: [1, p. 5; 6, p. 25-33].

Materials which do not meet these requirements shall not be accepted.
